1. Introduction

This briefing provides a detailed overview of the results of the Senedd general election held on 7 May 2026.

The Senedd and the 2026 election

The election of Members of the Senedd was held on Thursday 7 May 2026. The election followed the dissolution of the Sixth Senedd at midnight on 8 April 2026. This was the seventh general election held for the Senedd and the first under the new closed list proportional representation voting system. It was also the first time that 96 Members were elected, rather than the 60 that had been elected at elections between 1999-2021.

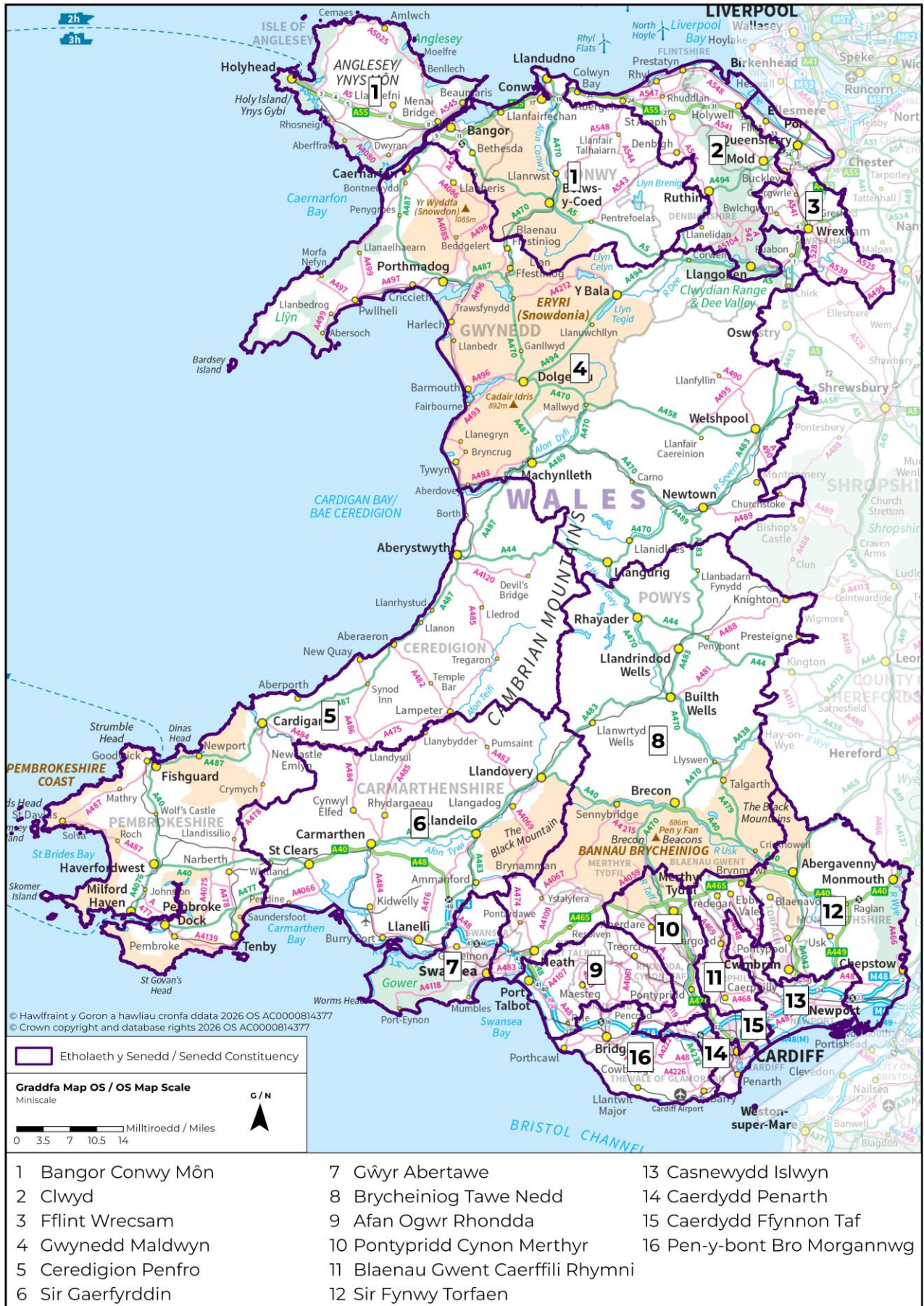
Counting of the votes took place on Friday 8 May, with the final declaration made at 18:05 in Gwynedd Maldwyn.

Plaid Cymru won the largest share of the vote (35.4%) and the largest number of seats (43), with Reform UK coming second with 29.3% of the vote and 34 seats. Welsh Labour were in third place with 11.1% of the vote and 9 seats, followed by the Welsh Conservatives who won 10.7% of the vote and 7 seats. Wales Green Party were in fifth place with 6.7% of the vote and 2 seats. The Welsh Liberal Democrats won 4.5% of the vote and 1 seat.

The turnout for the election was 51.7%, the highest there has ever been for a Senedd general election.

Constituencies

Members of the Senedd were elected to represent 16 new Senedd constituencies. Each was given a single Welsh language name by the Democracy and Boundary Commission Cymru. The constituencies are set out in the map below.



The electoral system

A closed list proportional representation electoral system was used for the first time in Senedd elections. Under this system, registered political parties could put forward lists of up to eight candidates in each constituency. Individual candidates (independents) could also stand in a Senedd constituency.

The election was conducted across 16 constituencies, each electing six Members of the Senedd. These constituencies **were determined by the Democracy and Boundary Commission Cymru** by combining the 32 UK Parliament constituencies into 16 Senedd constituencies.

After the counting of votes, the six seats in each constituency were allocated to political parties and individual candidates using the D'Hondt method. More information about the allocation of seats can be found in this **Senedd Research article**.

Initial **findings from the Welsh Election Study**, led by researchers from Aberystwyth University and Swansea University, showed that ahead of the election, public understanding of the new electoral system was low. In total, 88% of respondents either answered incorrectly or did not know about the new electoral system.

Data sources

The election data in this briefing has been compiled from statistical returns from each Constituency Returning Officer and **data published by the Electoral Management Board**. Sources of data relating to previous Senedd elections (1999-2021) are referenced at the **end of this briefing**.

This briefing uses the valid vote to calculate and report on turnout. The valid vote consists of all papers included in the count, including postal ballots but excluding ballot papers rejected at the count.

Note on diversity information

Data about the characteristics of Members of the Senedd and candidates at Senedd elections is not routinely collected and is therefore not included in this briefing.

In March 2025, the previous Welsh Government published **diversity and inclusion guidance for political parties**, which included guidance about

collecting, collating and publishing diversity information relating to candidates and elected Members. This is a voluntary action that political parties can take.

The guidance says that this information should be published by political parties within six weeks of the Senedd election. At the time of publication, there has not been any data published by political parties. This briefing will be updated if and when this information is made available.

2. Summary of election results

This section provides a high-level summary of the election results.

Summary of results

Figure 1 shows the number of seats won by each political party at the Senedd election. Plaid Cymru are the largest party with 43 seats, followed by Reform UK with 34 seats. In third place are Welsh Labour with 9 seats, the Welsh Conservatives came fourth with 7 seats, Wales Green Party came fifth with 2 seats and the Welsh Liberal Democrats came sixth with 1 seat.

New rules for the Seventh Senedd mean that a political party needs to have at least five Members of the Senedd to form a political group. Political groups have access to more opportunities for scrutiny (e.g. to ask questions in Plenary and hold opposition debates) and receive additional resources to support their work. In the Seventh Senedd, the following political parties were able to form a political group: Plaid Cymru, Reform UK, Welsh Labour and the Welsh Conservatives.

Figure 1: 2026 Senedd election results by party

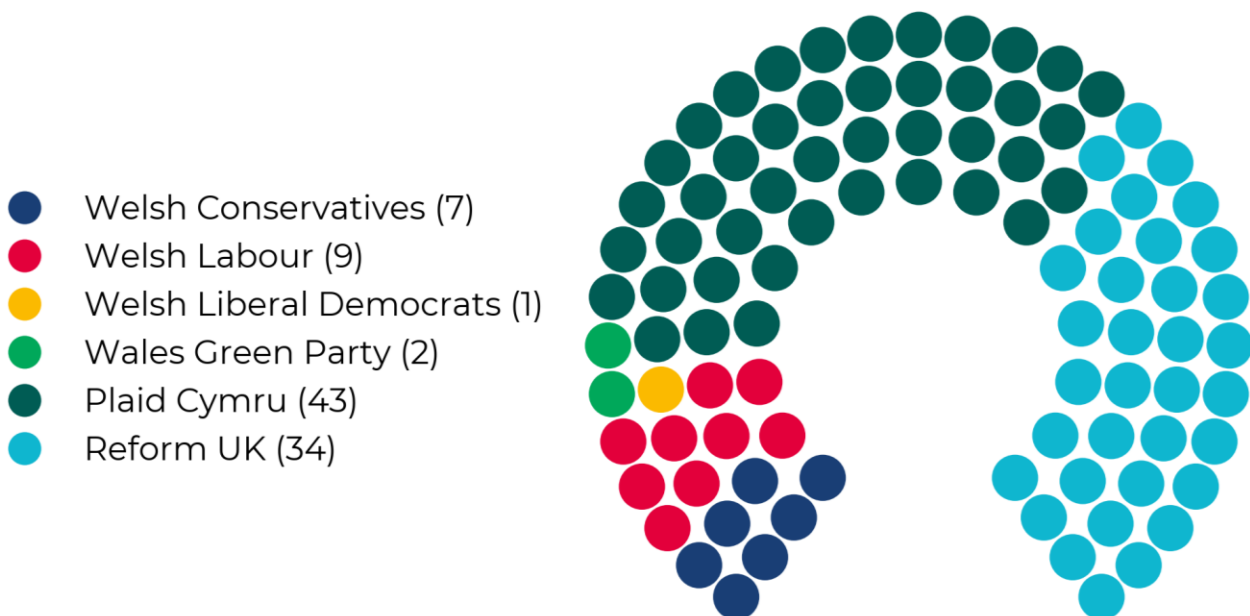


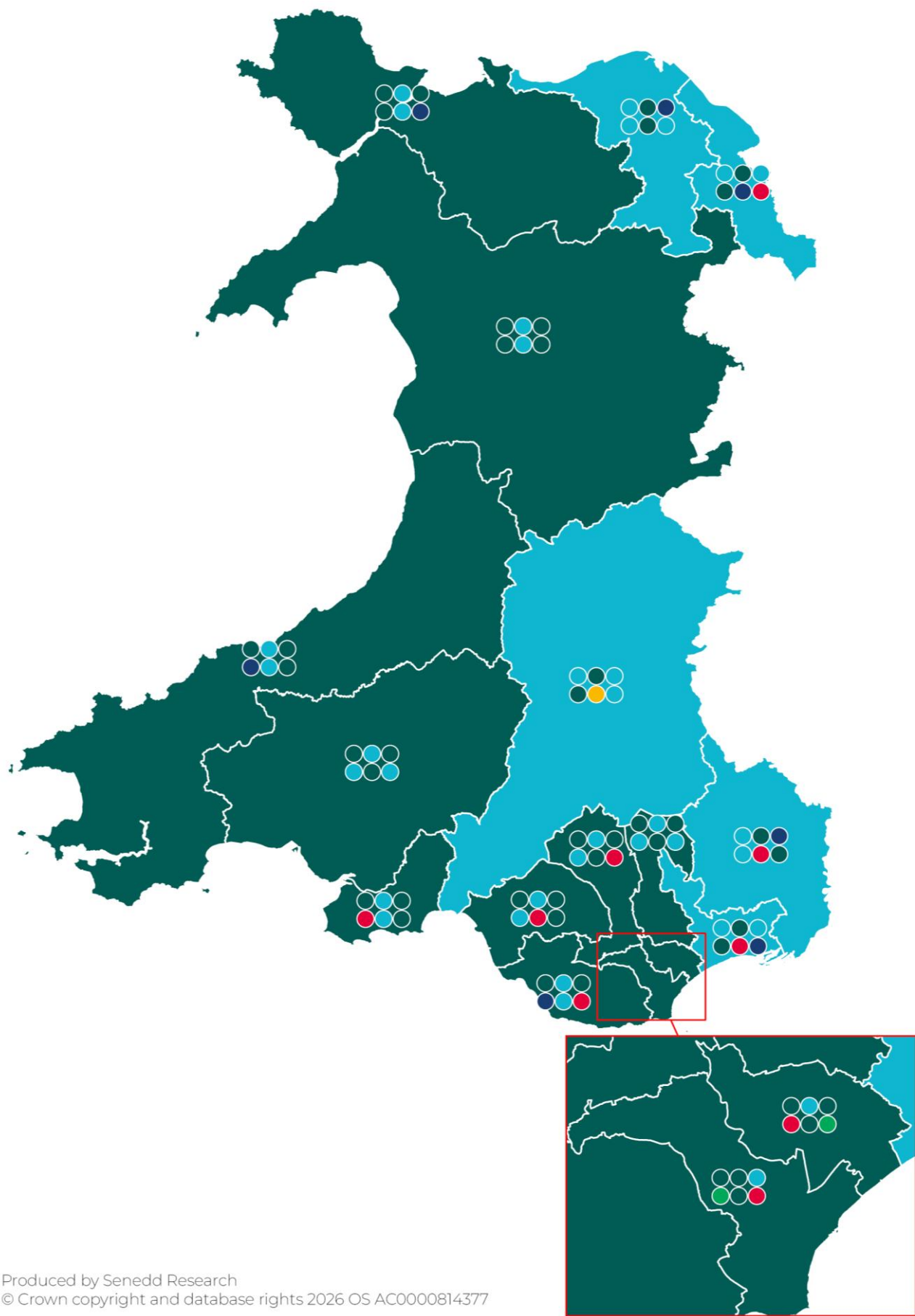

The distribution of seats by political party is set out in figure 2. Constituency areas are coloured by the political party with the largest vote share. Seats are coloured by political party in the order they were allocated.

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Proportionality of the result

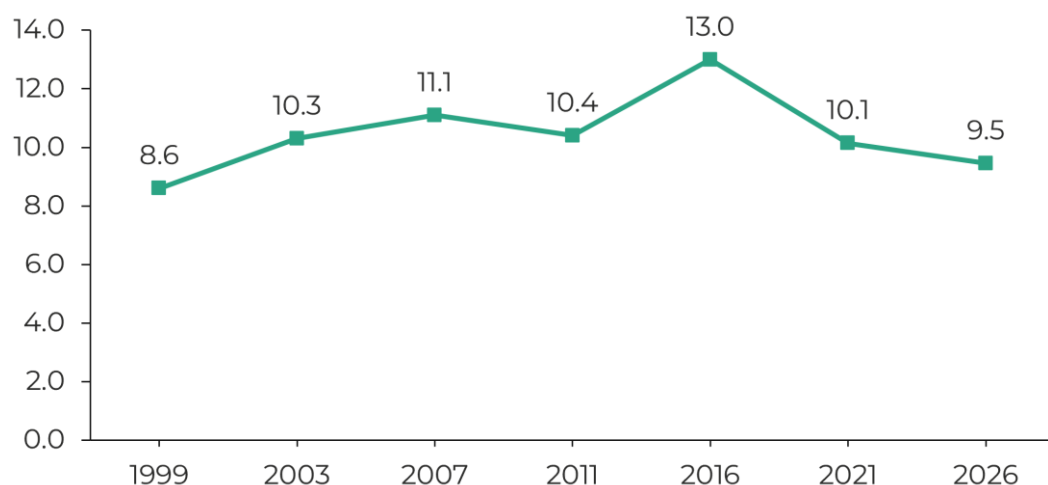
This election used a new electoral system – closed list proportional representation – for the first time. One of the rationales for introducing this system was that it would **produce a more proportional result** than the previous mixed-member system that was used for elections between 1999-2021. Proportionality means how closely the percentage of the vote that a party receives is reflected in their share of seats won.

Table 2 shows how each of the six largest political parties' national share of the vote compares to their share of the seats in the Seventh Senedd.

The **Gallagher index of disproportionality** is used in political science to measure the disproportionality of an electoral outcome. The lower the Gallagher figure, the more proportional the outcome. The index was used by the Expert Panel on Assembly to assess different possible electoral systems for the Senedd. The chart below shows how the 2026 Senedd election compares to previous elections.

Figure 3: Gallagher Index of Disproportionality at each Senedd election

The 2026 Senedd election was slightly more proportional than the previous election in 2021. In fact, other than the first election in 1999, it was the most ‘proportional’ election in Senedd history. However, the 2026 election’s score of 9.5, compared to the 2021 election’s score of 10.1 does not suggest a substantial improvement on proportionality under the new electoral system.¹

New and returning Members of the Senedd

Fifteen Members of the Sixth Senedd did not stand for re-election. Of the 45 who stood again, 29 were re-elected. There were 66 people elected to the Senedd for the first time. In addition to this, there is one Member (Nerys Evans MS between 2007-11) who served in a previous Senedd term.

Elin Jones MS and Lynne Neagle MS are the longest serving Members re-elected. They have both been Members of the Senedd from the establishment of the institution in 1999. Table 3 shows the MSs elected in 2026 by the Senedd term they were first elected.

¹ Gallagher index figures for the 1999-2016 elections were taken from the [report of the Expert Panel on Assembly Electoral Reform](#) (2017) and were calculated by Cardiff University’s Wales Governance Centre. The figures for the 2021 and 2026 elections were calculated by Senedd Research. An average of the combined constituency and regional list vote percentages were used to calculate the 2021 figures.

This table shows that there are only 19 MSs elected at the 2026 election who have served more than one previous term in the Senedd.

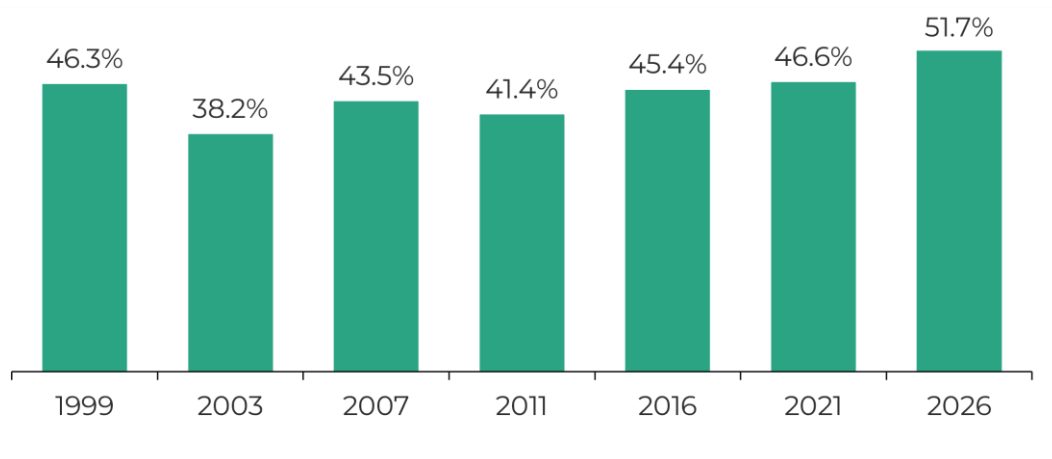

Turnout

Over 2.43 million people were registered to vote at the time of the 2026 Senedd election. Of these, over 1.25 million people turned out to vote. Based on valid votes, turnout at this election was 51.7%. This compares to 46.6% at the 2021 election.

The 2026 election saw the highest turnout since the Senedd was established, achieving over 50% for the first time. Since the 2021 election, a larger group of people are eligible to vote in Senedd elections, including those aged 16 and 17, as well as qualifying foreign and EU nationals. Figure 4 compares turnout in Senedd elections since 1999.

Figure 4: Turnout in Senedd elections (1999-2026)

Turnout was highest in Caerdydd Ffynnon Taf at 58.50% and lowest in Afan Ogwr Rhondda at 44.68%.

3. Detailed election results

This section includes detailed election results data, including a breakdown of each constituency result and an overview of the performance of each of the six largest political parties who stood candidates at the election.

Overview of constituency results

Table 5 shows the results in each of the 16 Senedd constituencies, including the vote share for each of the six largest political parties (and other parties and candidates combined into 'others'), the winners of the six seats in each constituency, and the turnout.

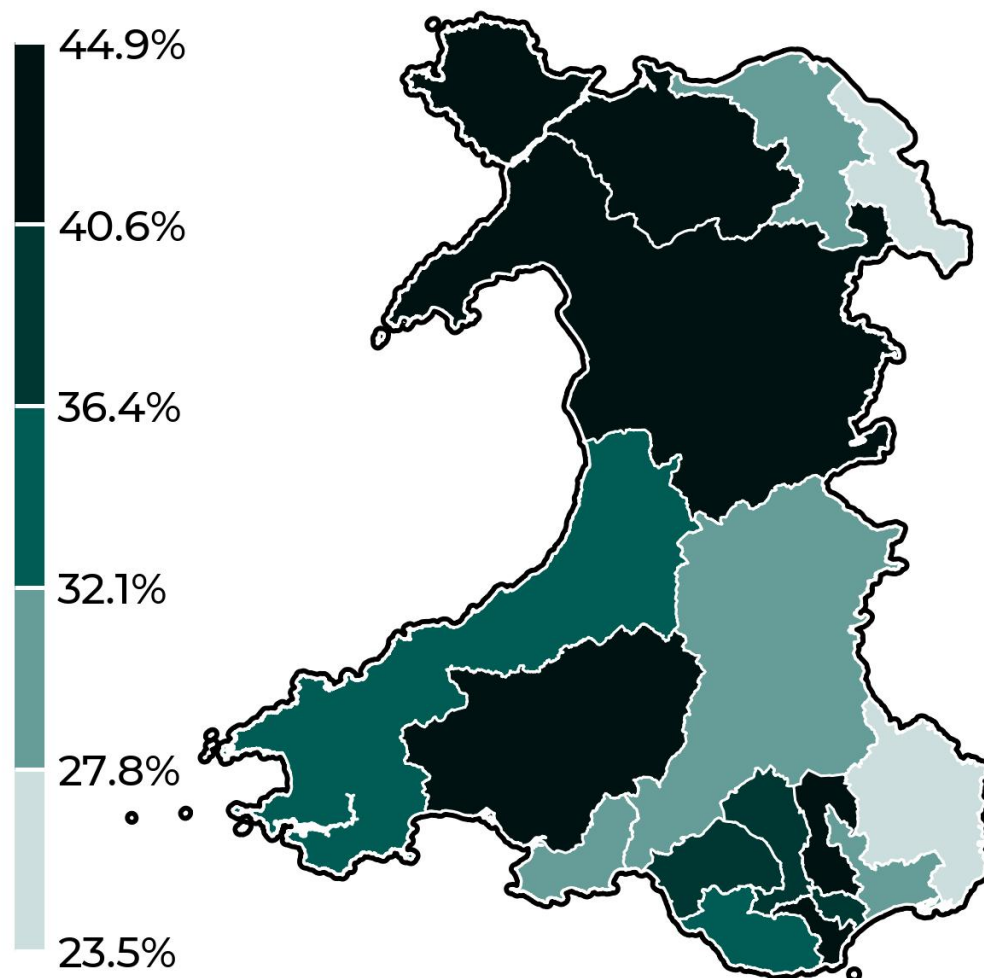

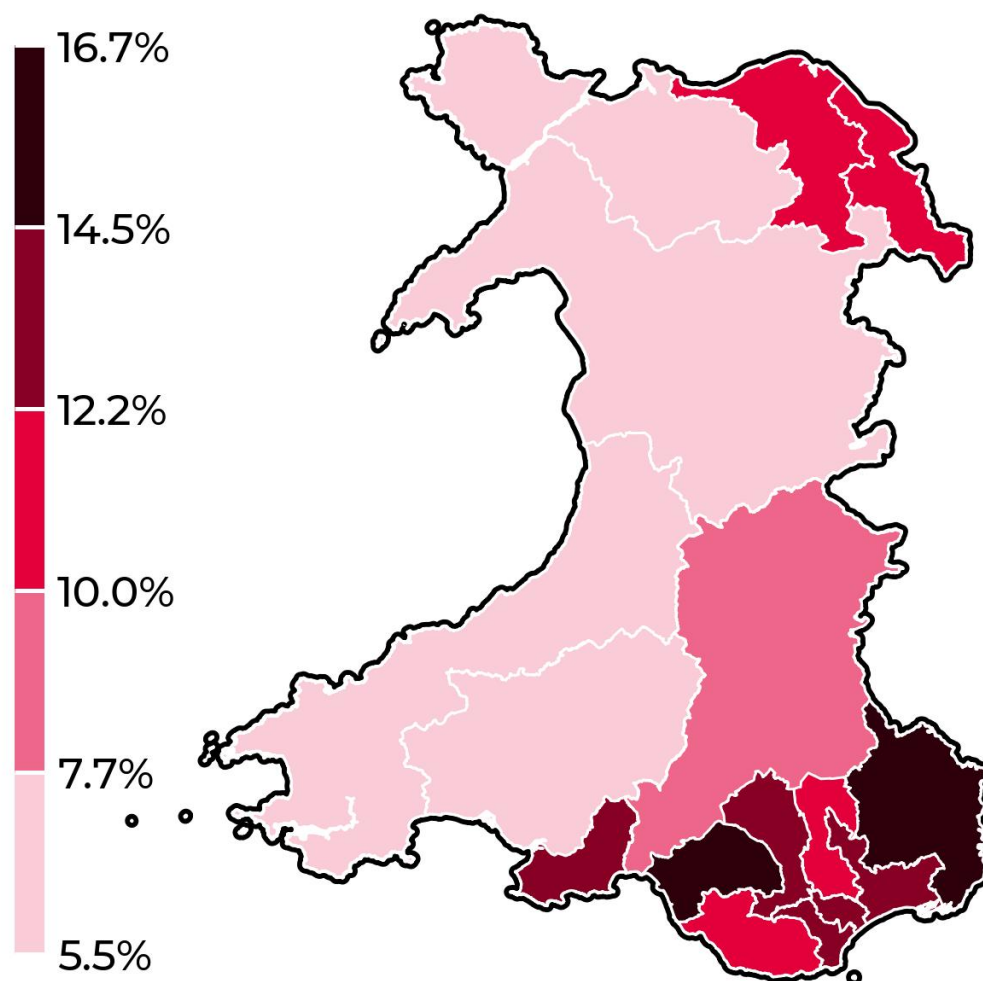

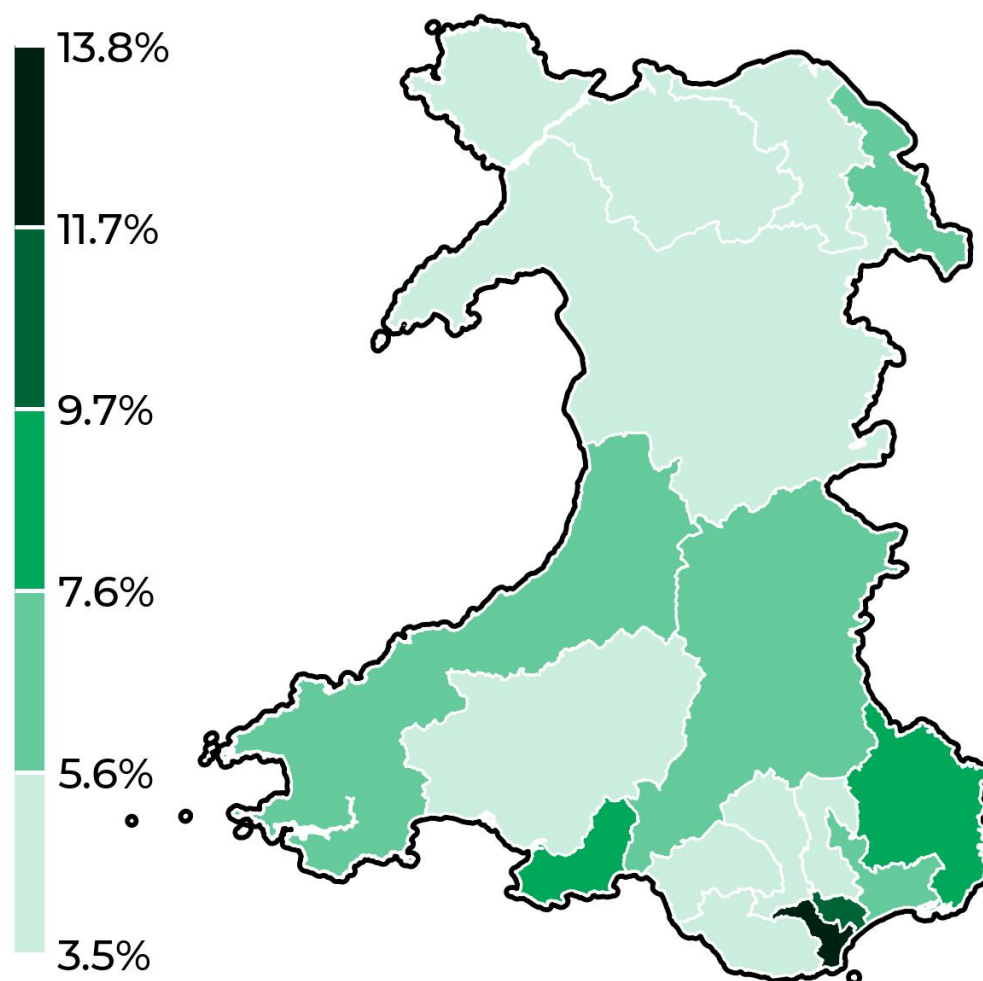

Figure 10: Welsh Liberal Democrats vote share % in each Senedd constituency

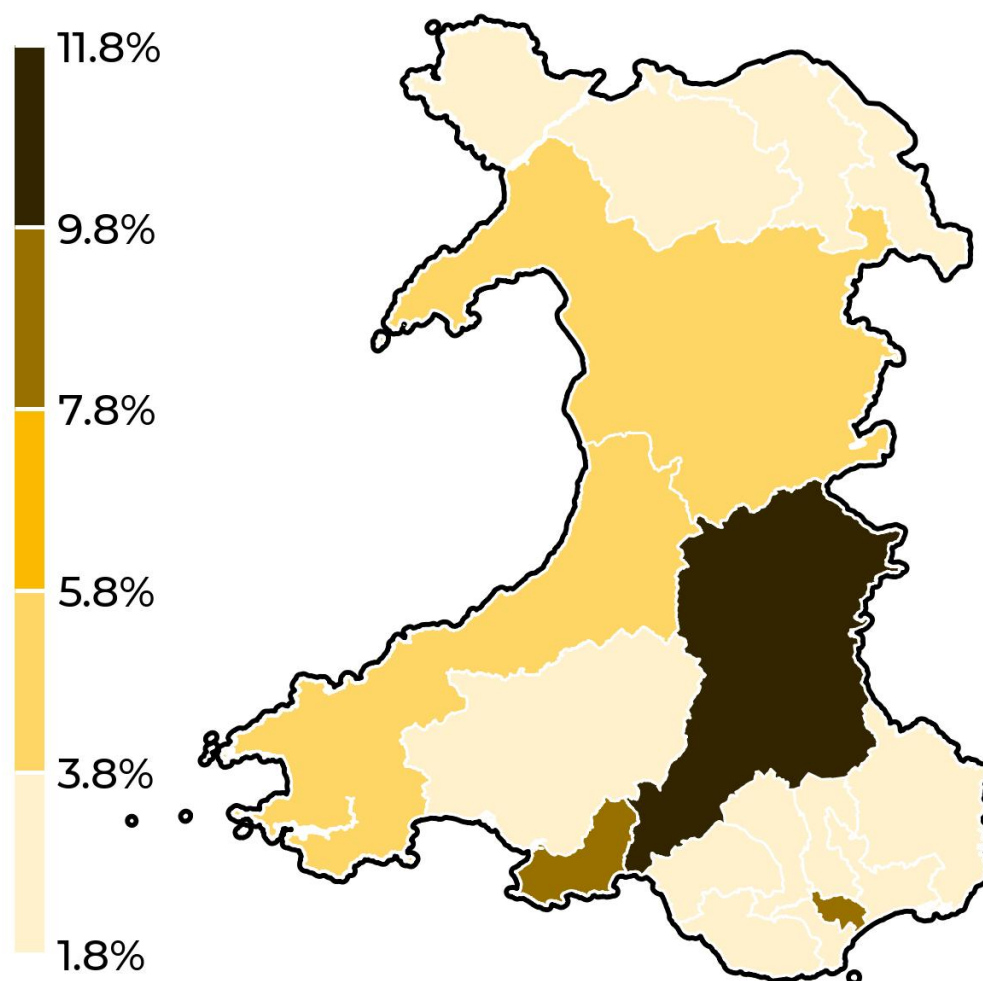

Other political parties

In addition to the six largest political parties, ten other political parties put forward lists of candidates in at least one constituency. Summaries of their election results are provided below. They are ordered based on their national vote share.

Heritage Party

The Heritage Party was the only political party, other than the six largest, to put forward a list of candidates in all 16 Senedd constituencies. The party stood only one candidate in all the Senedd constituencies, except Afan Ogwr Rhondda where it stood two.

The party received a total of 5,474 votes, making up 0.44% of the national vote share.

The party's highest share of the vote came in Afan Ogwr Rhondda (1.12%) and its lowest in Caerdydd Penarth (0.22%) The party lost its deposit (receiving less than 5% of the vote) in all 16 constituencies.

Propel

Propel stood in 2 of the 16 Senedd constituencies, putting forward two candidates in both Caerdydd Ffynnon Taf and Caerdydd Penarth.

The party received a total of 4,032 votes, making up 0.32% of the national vote share.

The party won 3.94% of the vote in Caerdydd Ffynnon Taf and 0.64% in Caerdydd Penarth, losing its deposit (receiving less than 5% of the vote) in both constituencies.

Gwlad

Gwlad stood in 6 of the 16 Senedd constituencies: Brycheiniog Tawe Nedd, Ceredigion Penfro, Gwynedd Maldwyn, Pontypridd Cynon Merthyr, Sir Fynwy Torfaen and Sir Gaerfyrddin. The party put forward one candidate in each of the six constituencies.

The party received a total of 2,479 votes, making up 0.20% of the national vote share.

The party's highest share of the vote came in Gwynedd Maldwyn (0.94%) and its lowest in Sir Fynwy Torfaen (0.23%). The party lost its deposit (receiving less than 5% of the vote) in all 6 constituencies in stood in.

Open Party

The Open Party stood in 3 of the 16 Senedd constituencies. The party put forward one candidate in Blaenau Gwent Caerffili Rhymni, two in Casnewydd Islwyn and two in Sir Fynwy Torfaen.

The party received a total of 684 votes, making up 0.05% of the national vote share.

The party's highest share of the vote came in Casnewydd Islwyn (0.56%) and its lowest in Blaenau Gwent Caerffili Rhymni (0.15%). The party lost its deposit (receiving less than 5% of the vote) in all three constituencies.

Welsh Christian Party

The Welsh Christian Party stood a single candidate in Brycheiniog Tawe Nedd, where the party received 0.56% of the vote and lost its deposit (receiving less than 5% of the vote).

The party received a total of 456 votes, making up 0.04% of the national vote share.

Britain's Communist Party

Britain's Community Party stood in 2 of the 16 constituencies, putting forward one candidate in both Bangor Conwy Môn and Caerdydd Penarth.

The party received a total of 354 votes, making up 0.03% of the national vote share.

The party won 0.24% of the vote in Caerdydd Penarth and 0.21% in Bangor Conwy Môn, losing its deposit (receiving less than 5% of the vote) in both constituencies.

Socialist Labour Party

The Socialist Labour Party stood a single candidate in Bangor Conwy Môn, where the party received 0.41% of the vote and lost its deposit (receiving less than 5% of the vote).

The party received a total of 285 votes, making up 0.02% of the national vote share.

Official Monster Raving Looney Party

The Official Monster Raving Looney Party stood a single candidate in Bangor Conwy Môn, where the party received 0.41% of the vote and lost its deposit (receiving less than 5% of the vote).

The party received a total of 279 votes, making up 0.02% of the national vote share.

Welsh Trade Unionist and Socialist Coalition

The Welsh Trade Unionist and Socialist Coalition stood in 2 of the 16 Senedd constituencies, putting forward two candidates in both Caerdydd Ffynnon Taf and Gŵyr Abertawe.

The party received a total of 244 votes, making up 0.02% of the national vote share.

The party won 0.15% of the vote in Gŵyr Abertawe and 0.14% in Caerdydd Ffynnon Taf, losing its deposit (receiving less than 5% of the vote) in both constituencies.

Social Democratic Party

The Social Democratic Party stood a single candidate in Fflint Wrecsam, where the party received 0.24% of the vote and lost its deposit (receiving less than 5% of the vote).

The party received a total of 165 votes, making up 0.01% of the national vote share.

Individual Candidates

This election saw 30 individual candidates put themselves forward for election across the 16 Senedd constituencies. None of the 30 candidates were elected to the Senedd. Table 18 shows the votes and vote share received by each individual candidate in the constituency they stood.

Lost deposits

In order for a political party or an individual candidate to stand at the Senedd election, a deposit must be paid. Deposits were **first introduced for UK Parliament elections in 1918** to combat concerns that there were “frivolous” candidates standing for election. The purpose of the deposit was to discourage candidates from standing who have little chance of winning.

For the Senedd election the deposit for **political parties** was £500 for the first candidate appearing on their list in a constituency and £200 for each of the next five candidates appearing on the list. This means a maximum deposit of £1,500 for political parties in each Senedd constituency. For **individual candidates**, the deposit was £500.

Political parties and individual candidates that poll at least 5% in a constituency have their deposits returned to them.

Table 19 shows the number and value of the deposits lost by each political party.

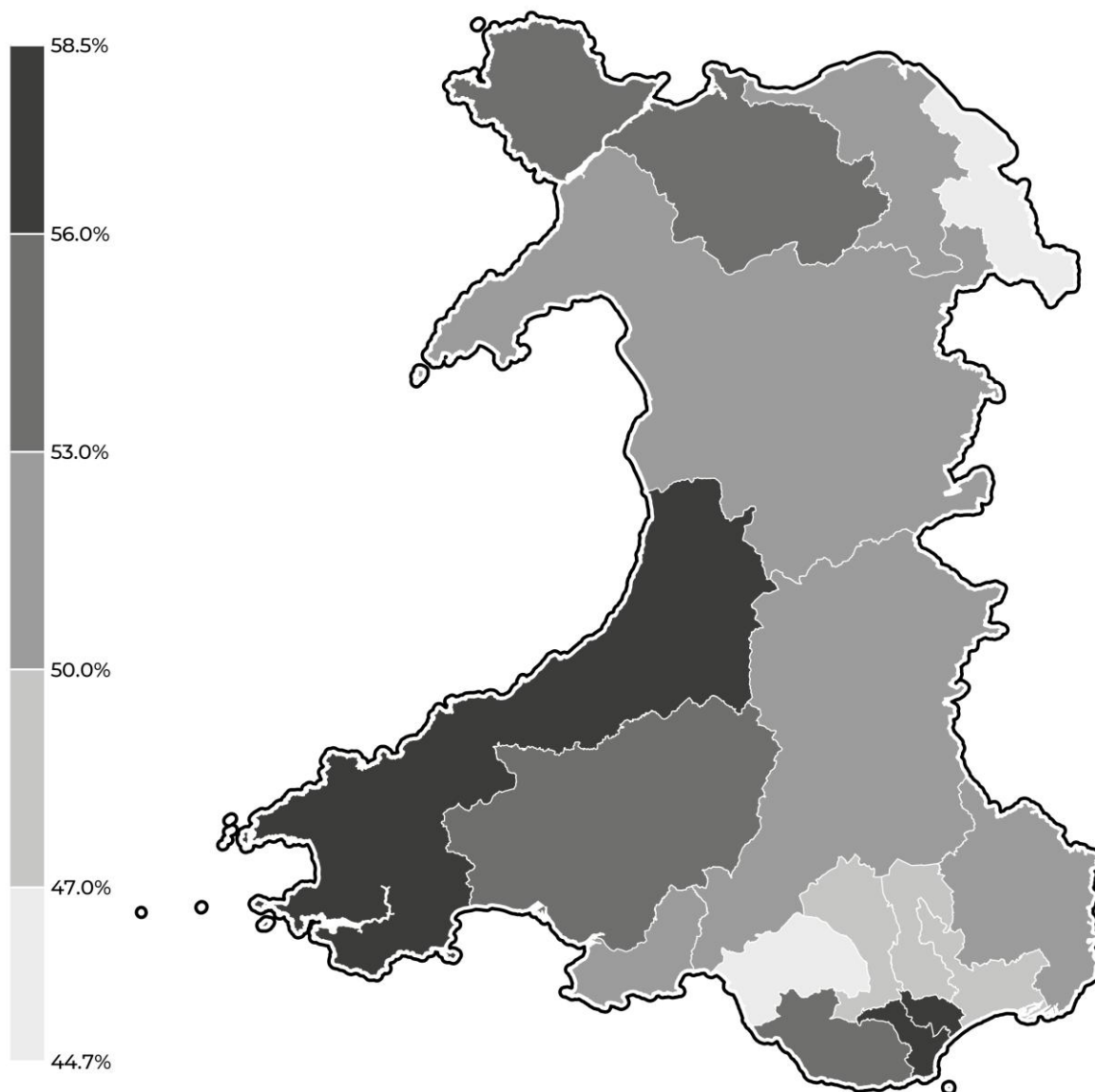

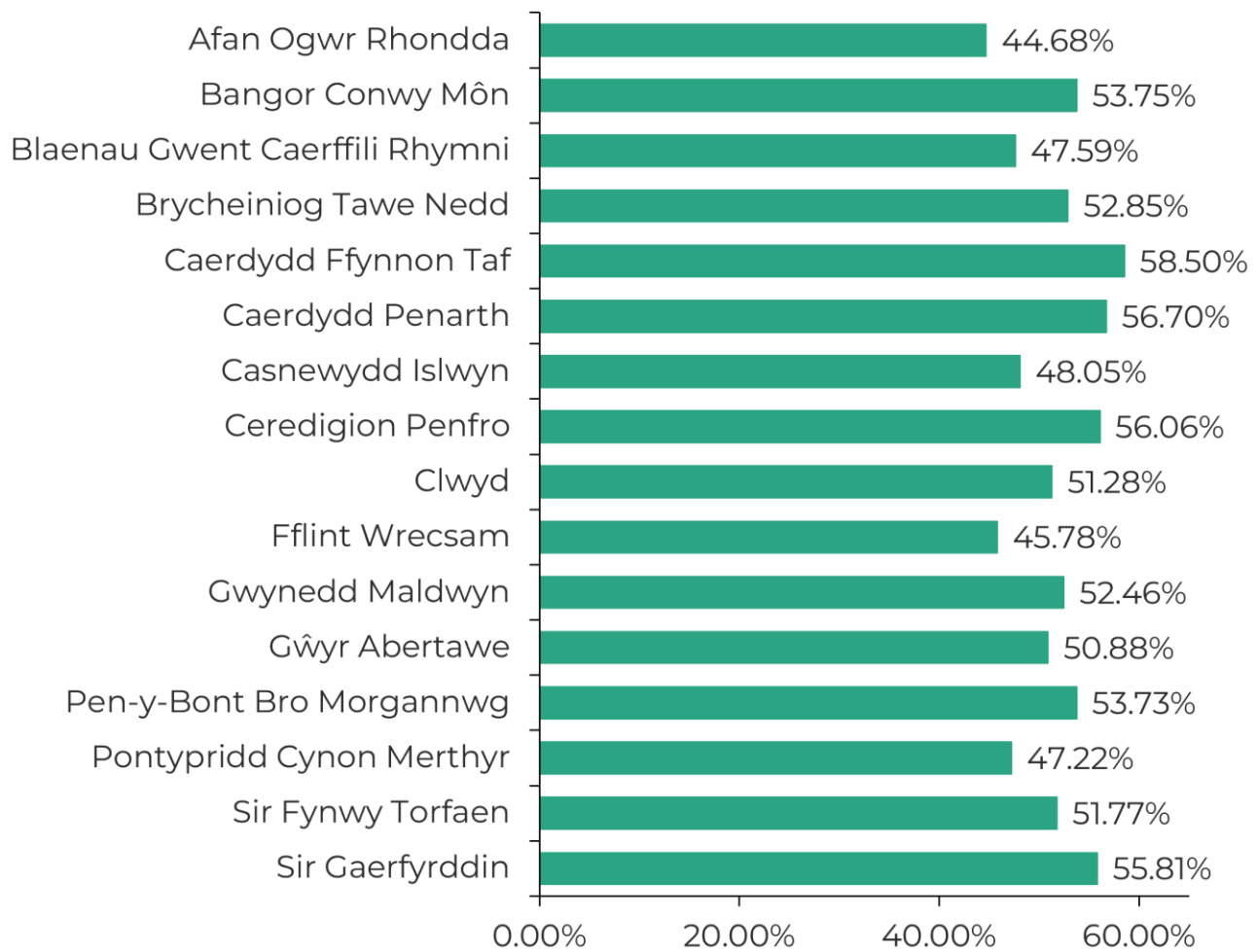
Turnout

Over 2.43 million people were registered to vote at the time of the 2026 Senedd election. Of these, over 1.25 million people turned out to vote. Based on valid votes, turnout at this election was 51.7%. This compares to 46.6% at the 2021 election. Figure 11 shows the turnout in each Senedd constituency.

The highest turnout was in Caerdydd Ffynnon Taf at 58.50%, while Afan Ogwr Rhondda had the lowest at 44.68%. Figure 12 and Table 20 show the turnout in each Senedd constituency, as well as the size of the electorate and the number of valid votes cast.

Invalid votes

A ballot paper for the Senedd election **must be rejected if:**

- it does not bear the official mark (not the unique identifying mark);
- more than one vote is given;
- anything is written or marked by which the voter can be identified (except the printed ballot paper number or other unique identifying mark); or
- it is unmarked or void for uncertainty

A total of 2,986 votes cast the Senedd election were rejected as invalid at the count. This breaks down to 98 for not bearing the official mark, 1,021 for more than one vote given, 135 for identification of the voter and 1,732 for unmarked or uncertainty.

All 98 ballot papers rejected for not bearing the official mark were in the Gwynedd Maldwyn constituency.

Ceredigion Penfro saw the highest number of invalid votes, recording 247 in total. Bangor Conwy Môn had the lowest number, recording 123 in total.

Table 21 shows the number of rejected ballot papers in each constituency and the reasons why they were rejected.
